Village Code Reminder

Village regulations prohibit the outdoor storage of trailers, oversized and commercial vehicles in residential districts. However, if needing to load/unload a trailer or camper for a move or a trip, residents can contact the Code Compliance Specialist at 910-295-1900 to request permission to store such vehicles on their property for a short time. Also, boats, jet skis and other watercraft are allowed to be stored on private property for no more than seven days each month.

Comprehensive Plan Nears Completion



After a year-long process, the Village's Comprehensive Plan nears completion and there are a few more opportunities for you to tell us what you think about the Plan. This fall, the Village Council will consider adopting the new long-range planning

document that articulates the community's vision for the future and identifies the actions we need to take to retain the high quality of life in Pinehurst.

While the draft Comprehensive Plan has been shaped by extensive public input to date, residents and stakeholders will have an opportunity to review revisions that have been made to the Plan since the initial draft was presented at the Open House in June. Beginning in mid-September, residents can provide their feedback on the revised Plan at envisionthevillage.com and at Village Council and Planning & Zoning Board public hearings that will be scheduled in September and October.

Since the Community Open House in June, Village officials have assimilated resident feedback into the Plan; clarified the vision for the Plan's five Focus Areas; added, modified, combined, and deleted Implementation Strategies originally proposed; and modified the Plan accordingly. The revised Plan has also been reorganized to more clearly and accurately reflect resident needs and desires for our community.

Protecting the character and authenticity of Pinehurst, while addressing the impacts of growth within our community and the broader region, in a way that ensures a continued high quality of life is a central theme of the long-range plan.

Several "Big Ideas" or strategic opportunities have emerged from Envision the Village to help position the Pinehurst of the future to better meet the needs of Village residents, businesses, and visitors while retaining our small-town charm and rural feel. While there are others, the Top 10 "Big Ideas" that have emerged include:

- 1. Reinvigorate the Village Center by developing a thriving arts, culture, and entertainment market to create a "Golf by Day, Arts by Night" atmosphere.
- 2. Create new open spaces and amenities within neighborhoods such as neighborhood parks, dog parks, gathering spaces, and community gardens.
- 3. Become a Digital Village and a premier destination to "Live and Work from Home" with expanded high speed Internet and wireless infrastructure.
- 4. Implement character-based zoning and pattern books in a comprehensive update to the Pinehurst Development Ordinance to promote high quality development in the future.
- 5. Become a pedestrian friendly community with expanded pedestrian, bicycle, and golf cart connectivity.
- Create a thriving business environment that encourages innovation and creativity with "innovation hubs", coworking spaces, and artist studios in the Village Place area near the Village Center and the NC Highway 5 commercial area.
- 7. Evaluate possible expansion and construction of new Village facilities such as a library, arts and entertainment venues, municipal buildings, and community parks to meet the needs of a growing and diverse population.
- 8. Seek ways to minimize traffic congestion throughout the Village, especially at the traffic circle and on NC Highway 5, to address resident concerns.
- 9. Expand and enhance stormwater management efforts to protect property owner interests.
- 10. Seek to expand the extra-territorial planning jurisdiction to the north of NC Highway 211 and west of US Highway 15-501 to ensure appropriate development along corridors into the Village.

We hope you will continue to help shape our future and honor our past by educating yourself on the revised Comprehensive Plan and providing your input in September and October. Please visit envisionthevillage.com for more information.

2020 Strategic Operating Plan Initiatives



Operating

The Village Council is committed to ensuring Pinehurst is a charming, vibrant community which reflects our rich history and traditions. Using feedback from residents and businesses through annual surveys, along with other relevant data, Council and staff have prepared the 2020 Strategic Operating Plan that includes the Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Budget.

The Council's four areas of focus

for FY 2020 include: 1) managing development and enforcing codes and ordinances, 2) providing interconnected pedestrian facilities, 3) maintaining high quality streets, and 4) providing recreation programs, facilities, and cultural events.

The FY 2020 Budget includes seven Initiative Action Plans (IAPs) at a cost of \$319,070 to address the Village's strategic goals:

Safeguard the Community

Police Department Accreditation: The Police Department plans to implement the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies' (CALEA) standards and apply for accreditation in FY 2020.

Promote High Quality Development and Appearance

Adopt and Implement a Long-Range Comprehensive Plan: Since FY 2018, Village staff and consultants have been updating the Long-Range Comprehensive Plan to achieve the community's long-term vision for the Village. The new plan,

funded in the FY 2019 budget, will be adopted in FY 2020 and an implementation plan will commence.

Small Area Plan for Village Place/Rattlesnake Trail Corridor: The Village will engage a consultant to prepare a small area plan for Village Place and the Rattlesnake Trail Corridor that will update and expand the previously adopted 2008 NewCore Master Plan.

Promote Active Living and Cultural Opportunities

Community Center: Construction of the new 19,693sf Community Center will be completed in November

Professionally Manage a High Performing Organization

- Build Baldrige Framework Systems and Culture: The Village will continue using the Baldrige Excellence Framework and will seek feedback from independent examiners in FY 2020.
- Expand GIS Capabilities: The Village will implement a GIS Strategic Plan after filling a new GIS Analyst position. Staff will convert maps to publicly-accessible technology and will begin building an interactive map for the Village's stormwater facilities.

Attract and Retain an Engaged Workforce

Workforce Learning: Plans to expand the Village's succession planning process and enhance workforce learning and development will continue in FY 2020.

Cannon Park Community Center Update

Construction on the 19,693sf Community Center at Cannon Park continues to move forward with significant progress on the building itself while site work is scheduled to pick up in intensity in the coming weeks. Site utilities for water and sewer lines, parking lot grading, the standing seam metal roof and interior drywall have all started and some will be completed within the next 30 - 45 days. Once open, the Center will be home to Parks and Recreation Department offices, and all program registration, facility rentals for athletic fields, shelters and the Arboretum will be managed from this new location. Also inside will be a full-size gymnasium, a multi-purpose room, small kitchen for use with classes and catering small rentals, an arts and crafts room, program room and a wellness room (no exercise equipment will be in this space).

As we get closer to the anticipated opening of the facility in early November, the department will release a facility brochure with new program offerings, rental opportunities and rates, and use policies and guidelines. Rassie Wicker Park Limited Availability

Because of the temporary relocation of Pinehurst Elementary School to Rassie Wicker Park, public access to site amenities will be restricted during school hours. Specifically, the Splash Pad, the newly renovated playground, the covered shelter, restrooms, tennis courts, shuffle board and bocce ball courts, and the hockey rink will all be closed to the public from 7:00am to 4:30pm on weekdays. Use on Saturdays and Sundays will not be affected. During the school year, the following schedule will be in place for site amenities at Rassie Wicker Park:



Solid Waste Reminder

Please remember that yard debris should not be piled along the roadside and should instead be deposited loose - not bagged - in the brown cart. Tree limbs should not be more than 4-feet in length or 6-inches in diameter. If limbs won't fit in the brown receptacle with the cover secured, they may be placed approximately three feet from the cart and securely tied in bundles no more than 18-inches in diameter and 4-feet in length.
