1. Call to Order by Mayor Nancy Roy Fiorillo.

Mayor Nancy Ray Fiorillo called the meeting to order.

2. Review notes from May 20, 2019.

The committee approved the notes from the May 20, 2019 meeting.

3. Community Watch Program Update – Glen Webb, Deputy Police Chief. Glen Webb, Deputy Police Chief explained the changes the Police Department is making to the Community Watch Program. There will be 4 zones divided up between the 4

Village Lieutenants, which will be the Zone Commanders:

Zone A: Lt. Tew Zone B: Lt. Hall Zone C: Lt. Leroy

Business District: Lt. Cheek/Ebel

The goal is to have more responsive Community Watch Program. Glen asked the group to send him information on any of the previous block captains or give him contact information of anyone interested in becoming one. The Police Department wants to be proactive instead of reactive. Susan Foster asked what the duties of a block captain are. Glen explained the block captains will be the main point of contact with the Zone Commanders and will need to be active and have meetings to communicate with the community. Glen explained that the Zone Commanders will come to all Community Watch meetings for each zone. Bill Keith suggested to check with the home owners

associations because with theirs they will not give out residents email addresses, so if a block captain wasn't on the board they wouldn't have access to everyone emails. Glen stated that was a good point to the contact the HOA's in the area.

Susan Foster asked about when neighbors are out of town and what should residents do. Glen said the Police Department has a vacation request form and the Police Department will go by and check on the home. Jenn Tomlin asked if block captains would receive quarterly reports and statistic as they did previously. Glen stated the plan was too eventually to get that information to the block captains.

Also, Glen shared with the group that the police department is going thru a uniform change which will include an outer shell. These are used to help spread the weight from the belt area to the shoulders and cut down on injuries.

- 4. Other Business Neighborhood Reports
- Rosie Ruggles with Oakmont Circle: Everything is fine in Oakmont Circle, nothing to report.
- Tom Campbell of Monticello: Stated he was going to the Aberdeen Commissioners meeting, after this meeting, to stand up and voice his concern over the Blake Blvd. development.
- Jenn Tomlin of Donald Ross: Nothing to Report.
- Charles Collini of Old Town West: Stated there is a Coyote problem in the Village, cats are being killed in the downtown area. He would love to the Village do something consistent about the parking and help residents put stakes in their yards to prevent parking in people's yards. Mayor Nancy Firoillo stated that is actually right of way and residents technically shouldn't put those up in their yards.
- Monica Converse of Lake Pinehurst: She has received a lot of responses on the great job the Village did with the Community Open House. There have been several animals killed at Lake Forest Dr. SE and Sugar Gum. Residents would like to see a four way stop at that intersection.
- Jim Rooney of Pinehurst Trace: He thanked the Fire Department for their services in Pinehurst Trace with the smoke detectors.
- Beverly Reynolds and Susan Foster of The Woodlands: Stated their neighborhood is having issues with short term rentals. 25% of the homes are now short term rentals, mostly with VRBO. Beverly Reynolds stated another issue is dogs and wondered if the Village could issue permits for dogs. Susan Foster thanked the Village for the nice job on the Comprehensive Plan Open House.
- Bill Keith of Village Acres: Stated his neighborhood is a volunteer POA and they are trying to get new members as they have lost around a third.
