Did you know the Village requires a fence permit for any fence, wall or column over 18" in height? The Village regulates the height and style of fences in Pinehurst, and a permit must be obtained from the Village prior to the installation of any fence or similar structure. 


This holiday season may look different than years past, but there are several events we hope our residents will enjoy:

## Shop Small this Season: November 23-28

Saturday, November 28, has been designated as Small Business Saturday, a day dedicated to supporting local small businesses that create jobs and boost the economy in Pinehurst and across the nation. This year, we've designated the entire week of Thanksgiving as Shop Small this Season. ## Library Needs Assessment

This summer, ETC Institute, one of the nation's leading governmental research firms, conducted a Library Needs Assessment Survey on behalf of the Village to determine what library services Pinehurst residents need and how much Pinehurst residents are willing to pay to support library services. The full results of the statistically valid survey with a 95% confidence level are available at engage.vopnc. org/library.

Although 65% of residents indicated the Given Memorial Library meets the needs of Pinehurst residents, a majority of residents indicated the need for several expanded or enhanced services. Other notable survey results include: 1) a resident desire for expanded operating hours in the evenings and on Saturdays; 2) 67% of residents believe the Village should fund and operate a public library in Pinehurst; and 3) 66% of respondents would be willing to donate to a capital campaign to renovate, construct, or expand library facilities. Over the next few months, the Village Council will weigh the community's current and future needs for expanded and enhanced library services with how much residents are willing to pay for those services.

# 2021 Strategic Operating Plan Initiatives

The Village Council is committed to ensuring Pinehurst is a charming, vibrant community which reflects our rich history and traditions. Using feedback from residents and businesses through annual surveys, along with other relevant data, Council and staff have prepared the 2021 Strategic Operating Plan that includes the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Budget.

The Council's three areas of focus for FY 2021 include: 1) managing development and enforcing codes and ordinances, 2) providing a safe and effective multi-modal transportation system, and 3) managing stormwater systems.

The FY 2021 Budget includes seven Initiative Action Plans (IAPs) at a cost of \$251,865 to address the Village's strategic goals:

#### Safeguard the Community

Police Department Accreditation: The Police Department plans to implement law enforcement

standards of the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) and apply for Police Department accreditation.

### Promote High Quality Development and Appearance

Update the Pinehurst Development Ordinance: The Village will update the Pinehurst Development Ordinance to reflect priorities of the 2019 Comprehensive Plan and revisions required by changes in NC legislation. The Village will engage a consultant and incur expenses in FY 2022.

Small Area Plan for the Village Place/Rattlesnake Trail Corridor and Pinehurst South/Hwy 5 Commercial Area: The Village will engage a consultant to prepare two small area plans for the Village Place and the Rattlesnake Trail Corridor, which will be an update to and expansion of the previously adopted 2008 New Core Master Plan, and the Pinehurst South/Hwy 5 Commercial Area. These are two of five focus areas identified in the 2019 Comprehensive Plan.

### **Protect the Environment**

Develop a Comprehensive Stormwater Master Plan: Develop a plan and strategy to address stormwater issues and concerns within the community. The Village will engage a consultant and incur expenses in FY 2022 for this IAP.

### Professionally Manage a High Performing Organization

Build Baldrige Framework Systems and Culture: The Village will continue using the Baldrige Excellence Framework to ensure systematic processes that deliver exceptional results and seek feedback from independent examiners in FY 2021.

Expand GIS Capabilities: The Village will continue implementing the GIS Strategic Plan for the Village of Pinehurst.

### Attract and Retain an Engaged Workforce

Workforce Learning and Development: Plans to expand the Village's succession planning process and enhance workforce learning and development will continue in FY 2021.

## Fiscal Year 2020 State of the Village Report

Each fall, the Village issues a State of the Village Report to indicate how well we accomplished key goals and objectives set by the Village Council in the previous fiscal year, which runs from July 1 to June 30. The FY 2020 State of the Village Report indicates the Village successfully achieved several key objectives and overall exceeded our goals for the year.

The Village Council establishes goals and objectives to ensure we are achieving the Village's mission to "Promote, enhance, and sustain the quality of life for residents, businesses, and visitors." This year, 99% of residents and 100% of businesses rated the overall quality of life in the Village as excellent or good. We focused efforts on eight initiative action plans and our residents and businesses continue to indicate high satisfaction levels with


### Solid Waste Reminder
