The Pinehurst Village Council held a Special Work Session at 2:30 Tuesday, May 12, 2009 in the Conference Room of the Pinehurst Village Hall, 395 Magnolia Road, Pinehurst, North Carolina. The following were in attendance:

1. Call to Order (2:30 p.m.).

Mayor George P. Lane called the meeting to order.

2. Motion to go into Closed Session.

Councilmember Thurman moved to recess the Work Session and enter a Closed Session pursuant to NCGS 143-318.11 (a) (3): To discuss with the Village Attorney litigation between Lydia Boesch, *et al*, v. Village of Pinehurst and regarding Pinewild Limited Partnership, *et al* v. Village of Pinehurst. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Fallon and carried unanimously.

GENERAL ACCOUNT

The Council, the Village Manager and the Village Attorney discussed the status of litigation between Lydia Boesch, et al, v. Village of Pinehurst and regarding Pinewild Limited Partnership, et al v. Village of Pinehurst.

3. Motion to adjourn the Closed Session and Reconvene in Open Session at 5:30 p.m.

Councilmember Thurman moved to adjourn the Closed Session and re-enter the Work Session. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Fallon and carried unanimously.

4. Call to Order of Work Session (5:30 p.m.)

Mayor George P. Lane called the meeting to order.

5. Reports:

Village Green Commission Report.

The Manager reported that the report from the Village Green Commission was scheduled to be presented at this meeting, but it is not ready yet. The report will be presented at the next Council meeting.

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Activities during Public Works Week.

The Manager announced two special events to be held to celebrate Public Works Week: 1) May 21- Pinehurst Elementary K-2 will view equipment, learn about operations and interact with staff at Cannon Park; 2) May 22- public will view equipment, learn about operations and interact with staff from 12:00 pm - 2:00 pm at Cannon Park.

- Mayor Lane presented a Proclamation designating the week of May 17-23, 2009 as "National Public Works Week" in the Village of Pinehurst to the Public Services Department of the Village. Assistant Manager Jeff Batton accepted the proclamation on behalf of Public Services Department and its Director, Walt Morgan.

Mayor Pro-Tem Tweed-

-expressed thanks to Assistant Manager Jeff Batton and Director of Parks and Recreation Mark Wagner for getting the railroad to clean up the area near the trestle.

-applauded the T.R.Y Weekly Pick-Up advertising campaign. The commercial is adorable!

-proposed including \$4,000 in the 2009-2010 budget go to Animal Advocates.

-asked about the speed limit on McDonald's Road West. She has received phone calls regarding speeders on the road, and requested changing the speed limit to 25 mph.

 Councilmember Fallon reported that the paving work of Riley Paving has been receiving rave reviews.

6. Discussion with Lane Toomey regarding BRAC.

The Council discussed with Mr. Lane Toomey, former Director of Plans, Mobilization, and Training for Fort Bragg, how the Base Realignment and Closure will likely affect Pinehurst. He feels the grand total of growth for Fort Bragg from 2005-2015 will be fewer than 5,000 people and that 60% of this growth has already occurred.

7. Consideration of Ordinance #09-13 An Ordinance Amending Chapter VII of the Pinehurst Municipal Code As It Pertains to Operations of Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices on Public Streets and Roads in the Village of Pinehurst (Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices).

Assistant Manager Jeff Batton discussed with Council the need for Ordinance #09-13. Upon the motion of Councilmember Fallon, seconded by Councilmember Tweed, Ordinance #09-13 was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0. (Copy of the ordinance is found in the Ordinance Book and in the Minute File.)
