The Village Council of the Village of Pinehurst held a Regular Meeting on Tuesday, May 25, 2010, at 1:00 p.m. in Fire Station #91 Training Room, 405 Magnolia Road, Pinehurst, North Carolina with the following in attendance:

Director of Planning and Inspections Andrea Correll introduced the Public Hearing and entered into the record a statement that the proposed amendments to the Pinehurst Development Ordinance are consistent with the 2003 Comprehensive Long-Range Village Plan. Ben Vaughn of Moore County Public Utilities stated that his department supported the amendment. It provides protection for the aquifer at minimal cost.
