Director of Planning and Inspections Andrea Correll introduced the Public Hearing and entered into the record a statement that the proposed amendment to the Pinehurst Development Ordinance is consistent with the 2011 Comprehensive Long-Range Village Plan. (Copy of the Comprehensive Plan Consistency Statement dated December 9, 2011 is in the Minute File.)

Robert Hayter, landscape architect representing Mr. Harris Blake, pointed out that Pinehurst South developed before the incorporation of Pinehurst, and there used to be three crossings over the railroad tracks to reach businesses in Pinehurst South. Now, there is only one crossing over the railroad track making it impossible to turn off Hwy. 5 directly to a business. Pinehurst South would like to erect off premises signage to advertise their businesses.

Mayor Pro-Tem Lapins noted that there is a proliferation of signs now, and adding more signs will not enhance this gateway to the Village of Pinehurst. He asked Mr. Hayter if there was a commitment from his firm to make these signs look good.

Mr. Hayter replied that it is not practical to make these signs match what is in the Village since this is a unique situation. He is not asking for a monument sign. He will do the best he can to make them look good.

Councilmember Strickland asked what will happen if the Council passes this amendment.

Mr. Hayter replied that the plan is to have two signs- an off-premises sign for the hardware building and another sign at Parker Lane to direct business to that street.

Councilmember Strickland asked about the signs on Hwy. 5.

Mr. Hayter answered that they will not be removed since they are grandfathered.

Councilmember Cashion noted that there are two big items on the Capital Improvement Projects list- the Public Services facility and the Community Center. He feels both play a vital part in where we want the Village to go. We need the Public Services facility out of the downtown so we can get in some paying customers; we need the Community Center due to changing demographics. We cannot wait ten years. He encouraged the Council to think outside the box, to take small steps instead of going forward with a whole project at once. He feels we need a new picture of where we want to go- a new picture of New Core, a sequencing so we can see where we are going.

Councilmember Parson added that we need to emphasize to the National Park Service that the Village Green parking is temporary. We will remove the pavers later and downsize the parking lot or get rid of it totally.

Councilmember Strickland moved to adjourn the Regular Meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Parson and carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 3:00 p.m.
