1. CALL TO ORDER.

Mayor Virginia F. Fallon called the meeting to order.

2. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

Village Manager Andy Wilkison led in an invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag led by Mayor Fallon.

3. APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA.

All items listed below were considered routine or had been discussed at length in previous meetings and were enacted by one motion. No separate discussion was held except on request by a member of the Village Council.

Councilmember Thurman moved to approve all the items listed and considered routine on the Consent Agenda. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Lapins and the Consent Agenda was unanimously approved.

4. BUDGET AMENDMENTS REPORT TO COUNCIL.

No amendments were made, thus there was no Budget Amendments Report to Council for the period November 13, 2010 to December 10, 2010.

5. RECESS REGULAR MEETING AND ENTER INTO A PUBLIC HEARING.

Councilmember Fiorillo moved to recess the Regular Meeting and enter into a Public Hearing on Planning and Zoning and Other Matters. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Lapins and carried unanimously.

6. PUBLIC HEARING #1: Official text amendment to the Pinehurst Development Ordinance Section 2.2 Definitions. This proposed amendment is to modify the definition of Agriculture, Livestock to exclude bees from this definition. The applicant is Sanford Toole.

Comments:

Director of Planning and Inspections Andrea Correll introduced the Public Hearing and entered into the record a statement that the proposed amendments to the Pinehurst Development Ordinance in Public Hearings # 1 and 2 are consistent with the 2010 Comprehensive Long-Range Village Plan. (Copy of the Comprehensive Plan Consistency Statement dated December 14, 2010 is in the Minute File.)

Sanford Toole, Pinehurst, beekeeper for 16 years and certified master beekeeper, emphasized to the Council that honey bees are not a threat to sting. Honey bees are bred to be non-aggressive.

He noted that honey bees are kept at the N.C. Governor's Mansion, at the White House and in many N.C. cities. Beekeepers teach children how to interact with honey bees- the photo given to the Council shows a child petting a honey bee.

Doug Middaugh, Pinehurst, declared that the Village must have a reservation about bees since that are not to be allowed on property adjacent to golf courses and the hospital. He also asked if the Council approves the amendment and a bee stings someone, is the Council liable?

Director of Planning and Inspections Andrea Correll stated that the Planning and Zoning Board wrote the proposed amendment.

Village Senior Planner Bruce Gould explained that the restriction mentioned by Mr. Middaugh is to protect the bees from activities in those areas, not to protect people from the bees.

Jan Wylie, Pinehurst, a neighbor of Mr. Toole, stated that she thoroughly enjoys the bees, enjoys watching them.

Sally Larsen, Eagle Springs, a beekeeper and an Eagle Springs business owner, stated that honey bees often visit her water feature and she has had no problems.

Councilmember Lapins asked if this is standard wording for such an ordinance.

Mr. Toole replied that the language was taken form a Florida ordinance and is fairly standard.

Councilmember Fiorillo asked how bees are bred to be non-aggressive.

Mr. Toole replied that the beekeepers look for the non-aggressive bees and use them for breeding. This continues the non-aggressive trait.

Mrs. Thurman asked how native honey bees help with "killer bees."

Mr. Toole answered that the so called "killer bees" act entirely differently than native bees. Beekeepers keep a close watch on their hives and report any bees that are not their own.
