



Village Council Summary of Meeting

- Fire Chief Carlton Cole recognized the following staff members for their efforts in successfully reviving patients during an incident and awarded them with the PFD Life Saving ribbon: April “Dee” Johnson, Eric Nall, Josh Womack, Rick Tufts, and Seth Dawkins.
- Fire Chief Carlton Cole recognized April “Dee” Johnson and Josh Womack for receiving a \$2000 NCSFA scholarship for outstanding academic achievement, character development, and leadership ability to assist with their post-secondary education.
- Council approved an ordinance adopting the Fiscal Year 2016 budget for the Village of Pinehurst.
- Mark Wagner, Director of Parks and Recreation, presented the BIRDIE process improvement report and recommendations on the financial sustainability of the Pinehurst Harness Track. Council formed a consensus to move forward with changes in the fee schedule and a budget amendment for replacing existing propane gas heating systems in the barns with an electronic heating system.
- Council approved resolutions adopting the Bicycle Master Plan and adopting the Pedestrian Master Plan for the Village of Pinehurst.
- Council approved that the Mayor or her designee be authorized to execute the contract with Van Camp, Meacham & Newman, PLLC for FY 2016 legal services.
- Council approved that the Mayor or her designee be authorized to execute the contract with Waste Management for solid waste services for Pinewild of Pinehurst subdivision.
- Council approved that the Mayor or her designee be authorized to execute the contract with McGill Associates for on-call engineering services for FY 2016.
- Council held a discussion regarding the Pinehurst Development Ordinance regulations on above-ground swimming pools in the Village of Pinehurst and asked for staff to research this further to present recommendations.
- Under other business, Mayor Fiorillo noted the proposal by DFI for redevelopment of Village Place has been tabled until the new Village Manager begins. Council also discussed enhancements to the Neighborhood Advisory Committee and Council formed a consensus to move forward with this project. Council formed a consensus to cancel the July 28, 2015 Regular Meeting. Lastly, Jeff Batton gave a briefing on two legislative bills and Council held a discussion on each of these items.
