



Village Council Summary of Meeting Regular Meeting September 9, 2014

- Council presented the resolution of appreciation to members of the Pinehurst Rescue Squad for their years of service to the Village of Pinehurst.
- Council approved a budget amendment to fund the guardrails project on Sugar Gum Lane.
- Mark Wagner, Director of Parks and Recreation and Dave White, Athletic Coordinator presented the proposed site plan for the bocce ball, shuffleboard, and sand volleyball courts at Wicker Park and Council formed a consensus to continue with this proposed plan.
- Mark Wagner, Director of Parks and Recreation and Todd Abbey, Executive Director of AC Sandhills discussed the proposal for AC Sandhills to use the open space at the West Pinehurst Community Park and Council formed a consensus to proceed with this plan.
- John Frye, Director of Financial Services, presented the final quarter of financial statements for FY 2014.
- A team of staff and Councilmember Phillips presented the report and findings on the street lighting study for the Village of Pinehurst including the recommendation to install street lights in Village Acres at intersections of primary roads, establish a task force to determine locations, evaluate the post-project satisfaction levels in Village Acres, and monitor feedback from other neighborhoods. Council formed a consensus to proceed with these recommendations.
- Jeff Batton, Assistant Village Manager and Council held a discussion about new yard debris cart size options and Council determined to select the size at a later date.
- Council approved an amended policy for the Beautification Grant Program to be moved under the management of the Beautification Committee.
- Council approved a resolution establishing a NC 211 Corridor Planning Initiative for the County of Moore, Village of Foxfire, and the Village of Pinehurst
- Council approved an ordinance amending Chapter 91 of the Pinehurst Municipal Code as it pertains to Animal Control making it unlawful for any person to intentionally feed any wild animal within the confines of the Village of Pinehurst. This provision excludes the feeding of wild birds but includes the feeding of Canada geese.
