Green Guidelines

At 90% or more, lead/acid batteries are the most-recycled product in the world! 60 to 80% of every new battery is recycled material.

Disposal of lead/acid (wet cell) batteries is controlled under North Carolina law that requires retailers to accept junk batteries 1-for-1 (buy 1, return 1).

Wet cell batteries thrown away in a landfill will pollute groundwater.

How to Dispose of Batteries, Wet Cell & Gel

- All businesses that sell lead/acid and gel batteries are required under N.C. law to accept old batteries in return. However, when a battery is turned in without the purchase of a new battery, N.C. law allows the retailer to collect a recycling “core charge”.
