At the January 13, 2015 meeting, the Pinehurst Village Council approved four recommendations from the Deer Management Task Force. The approved recommendations include: enforcement of the already adopted ordinance prohibiting feeding wildlife, a public information program on public health concerns related to deer, creation of a public information program regarding car/deer accidents, and creation of public education on plants and spray products to deter deer from eating residential landscaping.
