New Neighborhood Speed Limits of 25 mph

The Village Council voted in May to implement a 25 mph speed limit in the residential areas of Pinehurst where the speed limit on village owned and maintained roads is 35 mph. The process to install replacement speed limit signs in places where needed began on August 1. The new speed limit is in effect once the new speed limit signs are installed.

The Council's action does not affect state maintained roads such as Linden Road, Morganton Road, NC 5, NC 2, and Page Road. It also does not affect private roads in communities such as Pinewild, Fairwoods on Seven, or CCNC and residential roads where the speed limit is already 20 or 25 mph.

This action comes after several months of study and deliberation on the part of the Council, staff and representatives of the various Pinehurst neighborhoods who serve on the Village of Pinehurst Neighborhood Advisory Committee. After receiving concerns about existing residential speed limits and concerns voiced by homeowners, the Council undertook an extensive dialogue with residents and Police Department representatives before settling on the decision to implement the 25 mph speed limit in residential areas village wide. For

a number of years now, speed limits in Pinehurst No. 6, Village Acres and Old Town on the east side of NC 5 have been posted at 25 mph. With this decision by the Council, the residential speed limit in the Village of Pinehurst will be 25 mph unless otherwise posted.

The Pinehurst Police Department will help educate residents and visitors of the new speed limit before more stringent enforcement efforts are undertaken. An ancillary benefit to this action will be a reduction in sign clutter along Village streets. 🌱

Pinehurst Firefighters Recognized for CPR Saves

During May meetings of the Pinehurst Village Council and the Moore County Board of Commissioners, Master Firefighter Dee Johnson, Master Firefighter Eric Nall, Captain Rick Tufts, Senior Firefighter Seth Dawkins, Master Firefighter Chris King, and Lieutenant Jonathan Luck were recognized and received a commendation for assisting Moore County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) with successful Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) calls. Following established EMS standards, a CPR save is defined as the patient being discharged from the hospital after the event and records verified by the EMS system. 🌿
