Council Adopts FY 2015 Strategic Operating Plan

The Village's Strategic Operating Plan and annual budget for the fiscal year (FY) 2015 is driven by the Council's commitment to ensure Pinehurst is a charming, vibrant community which reflects its rich history and traditions. For the past two years, residents and businesses have provided feedback on the services the Village provides through the Community Survey or Business Survey. Based on that feedback, the Village Council has decided to focus on the following four service areas for FY 2015, while continuing to provide high levels of service in other areas:

- 1. Promote economic opportunity
- 3. Provide a variety of recreational and cultural opportunities
- 2. Provide and promote safe traffic & pedestrian mobility
- 4. Preserve the character & ambience of the Village

The FY 2015 budget maintains the current tax rate of \$0.28 per \$100 valuation and is slightly smaller than the current year's budget. Professional staff's daily stewardship of tax dollars, combined with sound financial planning has resulted in the Village's credit rating being equivalent to a bond rating of Aa/AA by the national rating agencies.

The FY 2015 Strategic Operating Plan includes 55 initiatives that total \$1.6 million to achieve the Village Council's strategic objectives. Pinehurst Code Reminders

Pinehurst is a beautiful place to live and we appreciate the efforts of our residents in keeping their properties wellmaintained. This is just a brief reminder from the code enforcement officer about some of the most common code violations:

- Please ensure that weeds and tall grass are not allowed to grow to a height over eight inches.
- Trailers may only be stored at your home in a totally enclosed storage area. The Village allows trailers to be parked outside of the storage area for brief periods of time in special circumstances (landscapers are working at your home, you are moving or having furniture or other large items delivered, etc.).
- For sale signs can be 12x18 inches or smaller, they must be dark green and white in color and they cannot exceed 3' in height.

Getting to Know Given Memorial

The 2014 U.S. Open Championships were very successful for the Given Memorial Library and Tufts Archives. While hosting several renowned events, the library earned great attention and international exposure. During these events, library staff was asked about what services the library provides in the community.

The Given Memorial Library is a public library that houses a collection of over 23,000 works and offers a wide selection of fiction and nonfiction books, reference books, audio books, and more. All library members also have access to a digital library to download free electronic books to personal electronic devices. The library hosts dynamic year-round programming such as lectures, children's story time, book clubs, and support groups.

The Tufts Archives is a hidden gem in Pinehurst. A history museum of early Pinehurst documents, artifacts, photographic images, and more from the Tufts years are displayed for the general public Monday through

Saturday.

As a 501(c)3 non-profit, the Given Memorial Library and Tufts Archives is entirely self-supported and relies heavily on its primary Fines, Rentals, funding sources shown in the attached graph. On Saturday, September 20 Animal Advocates of Moore County and the Village of Pinehurst are hosting a Microchip Clinic from 9:00am to noon in front of the Village Hall. A microchip is a permanent way for your pet to be identified if they ever get lost. This chip has a number that is registered only for your pet and can be read by a veterinary office, Animal Control or any rescue group that has a universal scanner. The price of a microchip for any size animal is \$20.00.

The Village of Pinehurst partners with Animal Advocates to provide these microchip clinics to citizens and to provide animal control support during nights and weekends when Moore County's shelter is closed.
