# "One and Done" New Solid Waste Collection Takes Effect in February 2015

#### VILLAGE OF PINEHURST

Beginning February 2, 2015, the Village will implement a new solid waste pickup schedule that will help keep your neighborhood neat six days a week! Under the new solid waste collection schedule, named "One and Done," all three solid waste types trash, recycling, and yard debris - will be collected on the same day of the week in your neighborhood.

The Village of Pinehurst offers several ways to stay informed using technology. Stay connected with the latest happenings and news at the Village of Pinehurst by signing up www.vopnc.org and find the sign-up link on the right sidebar. Download the free Village of Pinehurst mobile app available for all iPhone and Droid phones to keep important Village information at your fingertips. Don't forget to register your telephone number with the Village's CodeRED Emergency Notification System - an ultra high-speed telephone notifications. A link is provided on the Village website or you may call 910-295-1900 and one of our Customer Service Representatives will make sure your telephone number gets registered. Lastly, stay connected by following the Village of Pinehurst on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.



In addition, households that currently utilize yard debris pickup will be issued a cart specifically for yard debris collection, rather than having to bag it.

Beginning in February, once per week, residents should place all three carts curbside for pickup and you are done! By fully automating the solid waste collection process, waste in your neighborhood will only be curbside one day per week instead of three days or more.



Full automation of all solid waste collection will also mean that approximately 6,000 work hours per year can be reallocated to maintenance of streets and right of ways, making our neighborhoods more beautiful. ## Fiscal Year 2014 Annual Performance Report



#### Village-wide FY 2014 Composite Score: 7.51

On October 28th, Village Assistant Manager Natalie Dean presented the Fiscal Year (FY) 2014 Annual Performance Report to the Village Council. This report included comprehensive the

results of performance, utilizing the Balanced Scorecard (BSC) model, and an update on which strategic initiatives were completed, in progress, or not completed in FY 2014.

The Village Council adopted the BSC model as a means to align activities and resources with organization goals and improve decision-making. This framework helps to balance strategic focus among four key BSC perspective areas: 1) Customer, 2) Internal, 3) Employee, and 4) Financial.

The FY 2014 Annual Performance Report includes the comprehensive results of performance for the Village Council's

eighteen Strategic Objectives included on the BSC. Each scorecard component is scored using red, yellow, and green indicators based on established goals and red flag thresholds. Multiple measures of performance are scored on a scale of 0-10 and then a composite score is calculated. Overall, the Villagewide composite score for FY 2014 was 7.51.

## Street Lighting Conversion

The Pinehurst Village Council has a stated objective to protect the environment. One way to accomplish this goal is by conserving energy with the existing street lights. The Village Council has approved a plan by which Duke Energy will convert existing street lights from current sodium vapor and other types of lights to high efficiency LED lights. The conversion, which considerably reduces the amount of energy used by the lights, will cost the Village about \$2,350 initially, but will result in annual savings of over \$3,200. The conversion project is scheduled to be completed during the 3rd and 4th quarter of FY 2015. 🏶

# Solid Waste Carts Storage Reminder

The Village of Pinehurst would like to remind all residents of the appropriate location to store solid waste carts between scheduled pickups. The Pinehurst Municipal Code states that trash and recycling receptacles shall be stored either within a completely enclosed substantial structure such as a house, garage, shed or be stored behind the principal structure's building lines extended for all sides of the structure that directly face a street and be no more than five feet from the principal structure itself. Carts must be removed from the curbside by residents and stored in the appropriate location by the end of the day of pickup.

## Conservation Commission Songbird Nest Boxes For Sale

Are you still searching for the perfect attract nuthatches only. No need to holidaygift? The Pinehurst Conservation Commission's Greenway Wildlife Habitat Committee is selling beautiful songbird nest boxes that make great gifts for friends and family members. These wood nest boxes are designed especially for bluebirds, chickadees, nuthatches and Carolina wrens. Three box designs are available: the cypress box with slanted or peaked roof (\$15) will attract each of the songbird types. The pine box with slanted roof (\$10) has a smaller entrance hole and will

wait until nesting season to install the boxes. Overwintering songbirds roost in them to keep warm on cold winter nights. Boxes are available for purchase at the front desk of Village Hall at 910-295-1900. 🏶
