Got a car you'd like to sell? The Village requires that all vehicles displayed for sale be registered with the Planning and Inspections department. Vehicles can be displayed for sale for no more than thirty days and they must be registered to the current owner or occupant of the home. Vehicles for sale may only be located in the driveway. Unlicensed vehicles must be stored in a garage or totally enclosed storage area.

Municipal Code & Ordinance Changes

The Village Council recently approved several changes to the Pinehurst Municipal Code (PMC) and the Pinehurst Development Ordinance (PDO). First, the Village no longer has restrictions for irrigation wells and no longer issues permits for irrigation wells. The responsibility for the regulation and permitting of irrigation wells now lies with the Moore County Department of Environmental Health. Please contact them at 910-947-6283 for information on how to submit an application for an irrigation well. Second, the Council amended the PDO to change the Village's fence regulations. There were a number of changes with the most noticeable change being that the Village

now permits board on board and vinyl privacy fences. Owners and residents are required to have a permit before installing any type of fence. Finally, the Council amended the PMC to allow food trucks in the Hospital Development and Recreational Development Zoning Districts. A permit is required from the Village for food trucks to operate in these zoning districts and must be issued to the property owner. Fiscal Year 2016 Annual Performance Report Indicates High Levels of Resident Satisfaction

On September 17th, Assistant Village Manager Natalie Dean Hawkins presented the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 Annual Performance Report to the Village Council. The report indicates FY 2016 key performance indicators on the Village's Balanced Scorecard relative to established goals and red flag thresholds. The Annual Performance Report also includes historical trends for comparison to prior year performance.

There were a total of nine goals on the FY 2016 Balanced Scorecard to achieve the Village's mission to "Promote, enhance, and sustain the quality of life for residents, businesses and visitors." This year's 2016 Community Survey results indicated that an overwhelming large percentage of Pinehurst residents (94%) rate the overall quality of life in the Village as good or excellent.



Village FY 2016 Balanced Scorecard Performance Levels

Most key performance indicators on the Balanced Scorecard are resident and business satisfaction ratings obtained from the Village's Community and Business Surveys, which were conducted for the fifth consecutive year by ETC Institute. This year, Village residents indicated a positive perception of the Village and that the Village is moving in the right direction, with resident satisfaction levels increasing or remaining the same in 72 of 81 areas since 2013. In addition, the Village has rated above the Southeast Regional average in 45 of 47 areas and above the U.S. average in 44 of the 47 areas that were compared.

In 2016, Village resident satisfaction levels were the highest levels recorded in five areas among ETC surveyed communities under 50,000 in population:

- 1. 91% resident satisfaction with overall maintenance of Village streets
- 2. 95% resident satisfaction with the overall image of the Village
- **3.** 94% resident satisfaction with the Village as a place to retire
- **4.** 93% resident satisfaction with the Village's efforts to prevent crime
- 5. 89% resident satisfaction with yard waste collection

Businesses also indicated high levels of satisfaction with the vast majority of Village services, with 97% of businesses indicating the overall quality of services meets or exceeds their expectations. In addition 89% of businesses would likely recommend the Village as a business location.

While resident satisfaction levels on the 2016 Community Survey were high in most areas, there were some areas identified as high resident priorities for improvement. These include:

- Efforts at maintaining quality of neighborhoods
- Level of involvement in local decisions
- Enforcement of Village codes & ordinances
- Availability of recreation indoor facilities
- Availability of sidewalks
- Adequacy of street lighting

Overall, the Village continues to make progress at improving services for Pinehurst residents, businesses, and visitors. As the Village begins its strategic planning efforts in the next few months, Council and staff will use the FY 2016 performance results to make informed decisions about resident priorities and where the Village should focus its resources going forward.
