Preserve and enhance the community's character and ambience by guiding growth, managing change, and providing services in a financially responsible manner.





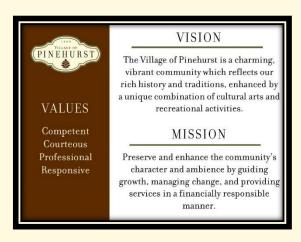


Village of Pinehurst FY 2015 Strategic Operating Plan

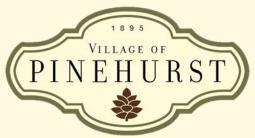

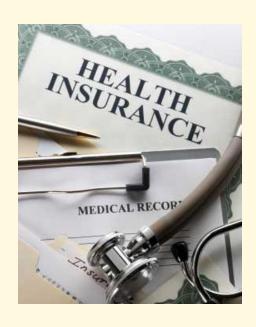

2015 Budget and CIP \$17.7 million budget; down 2% from 2014





2015 Budget and CIP

- Maintains tax rate of \$0.28 per \$100 valuation
- Project using \$1.7 million of fund balance, or savings
- Maintains fund balance of 37% of expenditures
- Funds merit pay increases of up to 2%



2015 Budget and CIP

- Total capital spending of close to \$1,974,400, down 15%
- Significant capital outlays include:
 - HWY 211 sidewalks and enhanced light posts
 - 4x4 Loader in Streets & Grounds
 - Automated solid waste truck
 - Storm drainage projects
- Total capital spending of \$7,895,900 in 5year CIP; no major capital projects planned

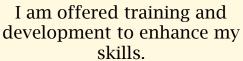


Administrative Policies for Volunteers

2013 Volunteer Survey Key Results

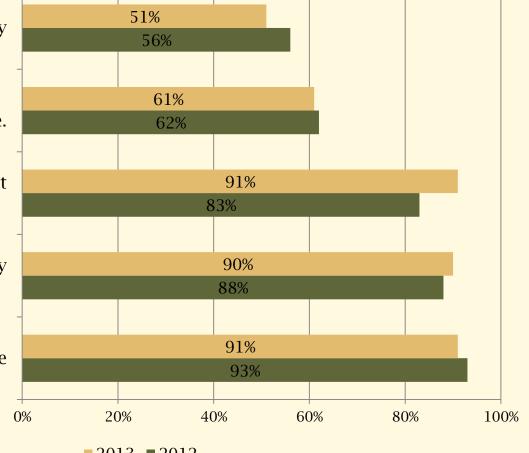


Reward and recognition programs are meaningful to me.

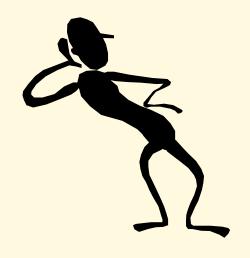
