Village Attorney Mike Newman briefed the Council on the status of litigation between the Village of Pinehurst and Mr. Mike McCrann, and litigation between the Village of Pinehurst and the estate of Mr. Hank Armstrong.

As of this date, the North Carolina Supreme Court has not ruled on the plaintiff's petition for discretionary review in the McCrann litigation.

Mr. Newman has reviewed the dash cam videotape from Sergeant Tina Sheppard's patrol car, and it is very helpful to the Village's position in the Armstrong litigation.
