Village regulations require that trash, recycling, and yard debris bins be placed curbside for pickup no later than 7:00 a.m. on the day of pickup and no earlier than 5:00 p.m. prior to the collection day. Carts must be removed from the curb by the end of your collection day. Please be mindful of traffic and ensure that your carts are located at least 15" from the edge of the roadway and not on the road surface.




Community Center Design Begins

The Parks and Recreation Department is happy to announce that design work has begun on the Cannon Park Community Center! The proposed facility will be designed by Oakley Collier Architects from Raleigh, NC, who were selected out of seven architectural firms that submitted proposals for consideration.

The Community Center will be located near the corner of Rattlesnake Trail and Hwy 211 and will likely include a full-size gymnasium with court lines for basketball, volleyball and pickleball, a multi-purpose room, various classrooms for programs and activities, offices for the Parks and Recreation staff, restrooms, storage and a small concession/catering kitchen. Oakley Collier Architects are currently working

on preliminary design and layout of the space inside, while the Village staff/design team will tour facilities in other towns to seek out best practices and efficient use of spaces.

The architects and design team plan to frequently present updates to the Village Council at their meetings. Please keep an eye out for opportunities to be involved in this process and provide your input and feedback as we work towards a final design and plan approval. The projected timeline for the project is to complete design by this summer or early fall and then put the Community Center project out for bids for construction. Welcome Center Partners with CVB



In January, the Village of Pinehurst, in partnership with the Pinehurst, Southern Pines, Aberdeen Area Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB), announced a joint effort to combine the resources and talents of both organizations to better serve area visitors at the George P. Lane Welcome Center on a trial basis. With the CVB's recent relocation of its operation to 65 Community Road in the Village of Pinehurst, both organizations saw an opportunity to work together to enhance visitor services by promoting the various area amenities, events, and attractions.

Enhanced services would include additional training for Welcome Center Ambassadors, more consistent operating hours, expanded marketing by the CVB, and a more extensive offering of printed materials promoting all of Moore County. The four-month trial agreement began in February and extends through the end of May. At that time, the boards of both organizations will evaluate the benefits of a more long-term partnership agreement.

The Welcome Center, located in the Theatre Building downtown, is an ideal location for visitors who are exploring the village on foot. This location also offers extensive visitor parking in the nearby Village Green parking lot. Visitors leaving the Welcome Center can easily access the iconic Pinehurst Resort and other lodging, Tufts Archives, quaint shops, and many dining options within a short walk.

As the second largest industry in the county, the economic impact of tourism generates over \$468 million annually from visitor spending and directly employs over 5,200 people. The CVB and the Village hope that because of this partnership, visitors will spend more money in the area, extend their stay, and eventually return for another visit. "In the hyper-competitive arena of tourism development, today's visitors' expectations for superior authentic experiences are higher than ever before. This is especially true upon arrival as they reach out to local experts for insight/guidance," said Caleb Miles, CVB President. He adds, "Some of the best welcome centers in the world subscribe to this partnership concept, melding the expertise of the municipality and visitors' bureau. We look forward to testing this premise together with the great staff and volunteers at the Village of Pinehurst."

The Planning & Zoning Board

The Planning and Zoning Board (P&Z) is an advisory board to the Village Council. They review all amendments to the Pinehurst Development Ordinance, proposed rezoning of property, proposed major preliminary plats of subdivisions, and proposed major site plans, in addition to performing studies and surveys requested by the Village Council. After thorough review, and oftentimes public hearings, P&Z makes recommendations to the Village Council for final action. In an effort to increase transparency and promote public involvement, the P&Z meeting schedule is posted online at www.vopnc.org/meetings and residents are encouraged to attend. Agenda packets for these meetings, along with supporting materials, are also posted online so that residents can review the materials and provide input.
