



## MAYORAL PROCLAMATION STATE OF EMERGENCY

**THAT WHEREAS,** pursuant to the Village of Pinehurst's State of Emergency Ordinance in Chapter 32 of the Pinehurst Municipal Code and Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes, the Mayor is authorized and empowered to issue a public proclamation declaring to all persons the existence of a state of emergency within the Village of Pinehurst; and

**WHEREAS,** Hurricane Florence threatens to cause significant damage to the Village of Pinehurst including isolated tornadoes, significant flooding, powerful hurricane force winds, downed trees, downed power lines, significant power outages, and substantial property damage.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I,** Nancy Roy Fiorillo, Mayor of the Village of Pinehurst, North Carolina, do hereby order:

**SECTION 1.** A State of Emergency exists in the Village of Pinehurst.


**SECTION 2.** The following initialed restrictions be put in place in the Village of Pinehurst:

1. Prohibit travel upon any street, alley, or roadway or upon any other public property, except by those in search of medical assistance, food or any other commodity or service necessary to sustain the well-being of themselves or their families or some member thereof;

**SECTION 3.** All Village of Pinehurst officials and agencies are to cooperate in the implementation of this Proclamation and the provisions of the Moore County Emergency Operations Plan and the Village of Pinehurst Emergency Operations Plan.

This proclamation shall become effective at 8:00p.m. on September 13, 2018.
