Green Guidelines

Circuit boards are the heart of electronic devices, but they contain small amounts of exotic elements that are toxic. Electronic devices contain compounds, particularly heavy metals that accumulate in groundwater and are not eliminated during normal waste water treatment. Disposal in landfills will eventually result in groundwater pollution. De-manufacturing and reuse is increasingly the standard for all parts of these products.

General Guidelines

Many stores that sell household electronics accept outdated products. Check your retailer's recycling program.

How to Dispose of Household Electronics

- Effective January 2011, disposing of electronic waste in any landfill is prohibited by law. This law applies to both individuals and municipalities and covers products such as TVs, CRTs, copiers, faxes, scanners, computers, hard drives, cell phones, etc. Moore County's Division of Solid Waste Management has implemented a collection and professional recycling program with collection points described in the following section. Please assist your municipal government to comply with this requirement by separating *any* old electronic product from your weekly trash and holding it for disposal at a permanent collection point or one of the periodic waste disposal programs conducted locally.
